# **HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS**

The holiday season is soon upon us, and traditionally property crimes rise during this time. Please make sure to secure your property and protect yourself and your family. Below are precautionary steps to follow. To view larger print, visit our COHO website.

# **HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS**

- 1) Watch Out for Social Media and Phone Scams. Be very careful about what your household posts about travel plans or absences. Beware of identity theft, protect your personal information on line, over the telephone or when out in public.
  - a) If someone requests a gift card or wire transfer for payment, or sends an unsolicited verification code, THIS IS LIKELY A SCAM!
     b) Legitimate businesses will not send texts, email or an unsolicited verification code
  - Legitimate businesses will not send texts, email or an unsolicited verification code requesting personal information or money transfers. If you are unsure, call the business and ask for clarification. OR call the police for assistance.
- 2) **Doors, Windows, and Locks.** Be sure your doors are locked, including the door from the garage into the house, as burglaries often occur through an unlocked door or window.
- 3) Light It Up. Exterior lights on all sides of your home (especially motion activated) are a great deterrent to intruders. Use automatic timers to control lights in your home.
- 4) Know Your Neighbors. Neighbors watching out for neighbors is the best crime deterrance imaginable! Encourage your neighbors to report suspicious behavior.
- 5) Mail, papers and deliveries. When leaving home for an extended time, have a neighbor or family member watch your house and pick up mail and newspapers. Beware of package thieves, re-direct deliveries to a safe location or entrust someone to retrieve them.
- 6) Close Those Curtains! Holiday gifts should not be visible through the windows and doors of your home.
- 7) Remember "Never Unlocked, Nothing in View". Lock your vehicle, hide any packages or possessions and be sure to take your keys. This is as important at home as well as when you are away.
- 8) Never Drink and Drive! Eat before consuming alcoholic beverages, remember only time will eliminate acohol from the body, know your safe limit, and always have a designated driver.
- 9) Know your surroundings! Always be aware of surroundings and ask for an escort or go to a public or well lit place, and dial 9-1-1, if you feel suspicious of anyone.
- 10) **Children.** Never allow children to return to the vehicle alone and they should never be left unattended in a vehicle. Teach your children thier full name, address and/or telephone number should they get lost or separated from you.
