#### HIDDEN OAKS STREET OVERLAY PROJECT

This year, the street overlay project will occur in the Hidden Oaks subdivision. The project is slated for the second week of May, weather permitting, and will include an asphalt overlay along with minor base repairs. The scope of the project is as follows: the entirety of Coates Trail; and Hidden Oaks Drive from Coates Trail to Bankhead Highway.

Closer to the start of the project, staff will push out more information via the newsletter, the Hudson Oaks website, and Facebook as it relates to traffic detours and timelines. The entire project will last two to three days, and residents will maintain access to their homes and driveways throughout the entirety of the project.

### NEW PARKER COUNTY CONVENIENCE CENTER

As of April 6, 2021, a new Parker County Convenience Center is open to residents of Precinct 3 and Precinct 4.

The new Convenience Center will be open year-round and will take the place of the Parker County Annual Clean-Up day.

The center, organized by Parker County Precinct 3 and Precinct 4 Commissioners, accepts household hazardous waste and bulk trash for a fee (see right column) and residential brush for <u>FREE</u>. The center also offers <u>FREE</u> mulch to Precinct 3 and Precinct 4 residents.

The convenience center is located at 2833 Tin Top Road in Weatherford and is open Thursdays and Fridays from 9 AM to 3 PM and on Saturdays from 9 AM to 1 PM.

The center does not accept household garbage (ex. kitchen) and is not licensed to accept commercial waste or brush.

## CONVENIENCE CENTER FEE SCHEDULE

#### Pricing per item:

- Tires (passenger car and light truck): first 4 free, \$2 for each additional
- Truck and tractor tires @ vendor cost determined by the size (no tires on rims)
- General items: \$5 per item (examples: bulk furniture, if brought as a single item: sofa, mattress, TV, etc.)

Pricing per vehicle size (other waste):

- Passenger cars and SUVs are \$10
- Vans and pickup trucks (bed level) are \$15
- Pickup trucks above bed level are \$20- Trailers are \$40
- Large trailers are \$60

Credit and debit cards accepted for a \$2 fee.
